CHURCHES AS COMMUNITY CENTERS IN COLOMBIA

Sometimes outsiders see the church as a club for members only and their buildings as a kind of clubhouse. This is not the case in Medellin, Colombia where two Covenant churches have become community centers in the eyes of the community. They have become a vital part of the community and are seen as a blessing. It is not a coincidence that both are healthy and growing.

In partnership with Covenant World Relief, two Covenant churches in this poor area of Medellin have been able to expand their facilities. As a result these two churches now have the capacity to care for 300 pre-school children aged eighteen months to five years. The churches are partnering with the city to provide early childhood education daily from 8 am-4 pm. In addition to providing education, the church also provides nutritious meals to the students. The vast majority of these children come from families living in poverty. For sixty percent of the children, these are the only nutritious meals that they receive.

Pastor Javier, one of the pastors of the Covenant churches, knows that education is one of the most important paths to breaking the cycle of poverty. Through this early education program the children are intellectually, developmentally and socially more prepared to succeed when they enter the public school system.

Pastor Javier dreams of even greater impact of the Covenant churches in their communities. He would like to be able to care for more children. Currently there is a waiting list of one hundred children. He would also like to provide care for the elderly in the community. The only limitation is space. Pastor Javier dreams of gaining more space to be able to better serve his community in the name of Jesus.

HAITI UPDATE

The media coverage of Haiti has gradually waned since the devastating earthquake on January 12, 2010. However, CWR remains very involved in recovery and long-term development with our partners. The devastating earthquake resulted in more than 230,000 deaths and left more

than one million homeless. Because of the difficult situation in Haiti before the earthquake and the degree of devastation, CWR expects to be involved in Haiti for years to come. In recent months CWR has sent funds and ECC volunteer medical personnel to help address the cholera crisis. We expect to be working with our partners and the most vulnerable in Haiti for years to come.

BEST PRACTICES FOR SERVING THE MARGINALIZED IN ALBANIA

Driving into the village outside of Korca, Albania, I asked Dr. Patriot, "How did Medical Ambassadors Albania decide to address the waste water drainage problem in this village?" Dr. Patriot replied, "We didn't decide the project—the community did. That's the way it should be. Unless local people are involved in that decision they will never take full ownership." As we arrived at the site, I saw many people digging ditches and laying drainage pipes. Dr. Patriot explained that the whole community is participating in the labor and providing some of the materials.

The community leadership is also providing some of the funding.

Since the village is situated at the base of a steep hill, whenever it rains, the runoff floods the village below. Sometimes the latrines overflow and occasionally the contaminated water gets into wells in that area, causing water-borne illnesses. The waste water drainage problem exists throughout the village, but the CWR funded project is being carried out in the worst affected area. The majority of people in that area are Roma people, those who are lowest on the social ladder. The fact that the community leaders chose to address the problem in that area surprised even Dr. Patriot. Roma people and other marginalized people are often ignored, but not in this village.

We are thankful for partners like Medical Ambassadors Albania who know and practice best transformational community development principles.
