What is Prayer?

Simply put, prayer is entering into a conversation with, and in the presence of, God the Father. Like a conversation with a friend, sometimes you talk and sometimes you listen. God wants us to turn to him, rely on him, and gain our direction from him. He wants to hear from us, and he's ready to listen to all our questions, fears, and pains.

What Do I say?

Say whatever is on your heart. Be natural. It's not about saying grand or flowery things, it's just you talking to your Creator about... stuff.

If you are not sure, ask God through his Holy Spirit to guide you and bring to mind those issues that need to be resolved. Prayer serves many purposes, such as dealing with issues with self, issues with others, relationship problems between God and ourselves, and spiritual warfare, to name a few.

Still not sure? Take a look at Matthew 6:9-13(NIV). In these verses, Jesus teaches us how to pray when he says, "This, then, is how you should pray: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."

Just Prayer: Sundays at 5 p.m. meet with like-minded believers to pray for personal, local, and global concerns.

Prayer Companions: Prayer companions are trained to pray with people during the worship services. They are available at the end of the service to intercede with those who desire prayer.

Saturday Prayer Force: Each week one church council member volunteers to pray at the church on Saturday afternoon in anticipation of the Sunday worship services. Each council member pairs up with a person from the congregation to engage in this ministry.

Sunday Prayer: Those who feel called to pray for and during the worship service do so each week in a room outside the sanctuary.

Monday Prayer: You are invited to come pray in the sanctuary on Monday mornings at 9 a.m.

Prayer Chain: The prayer chain is composed of dedicated members of Faith Covenant who will intercede on your behalf. All you need to do is call or e-mail the church office and the request will be forwarded to

Special Events: Occasionally, the body of believers at Faith Covenant Church gets together to pray corporately. We call these Concerts of Prayer. Everyone is invited to participate!

Prayer Chain

The purpose of the Good Samaritan Church Prayer Chain is to widen the circle of prayer for those people and concerns that are brought to the attention of the prayer chain team.

The Objective of the Prayer Chain is:

- 1. To make immediate prayer available to anyone in the church body at any time.
- 2. To unite our hearts in prayer, therefore, availing ourselves of the tremendous power available when we take our requests to God.
- 3. To cause the body to be knit together in love through prayer for one another.

"The great people of the earth today are the people who pray. I do not mean those who talk about prayer, nor those who can explain about prayer; but I mean those people who take TIME and pray.

TIME <u>must</u> be taken from something else. This something else is important--very important and pressing, but still LESS important and LESS pressing than prayer" (S. D. Gordon).

To start the Prayer Chain:

- 1. Call one of the coordinators.
- 2. Prayer requests may come from any source (chain members, pastors, teachers, anyone in need of prayer).
- 3. Prayer requests may be for any need, concern, decision, or person(s) that has the need of God's care.
- 4. Include only the amount of information you want communicated; only the bare essentials. The Lord already knows all the details. If the prayer is too personal, then ask for "Silent Prayer" for God's help.
- 5. Verify that the person to be prayed for *wants* to be prayed for.
- 6. Answered prayer may also be called in to the Prayer Chain. It's a great encouragement to Prayer Chain members to know how and when their prayers were answered.
 "But the salvation of the righteous is of the Lord: He is their strength in the time of trouble" (Psalm 37:39).

The First Responder team at Grace Hills Bible Church, an Evangelical Covenant Church congregation, is letting people in their community know someone is praying for them.

A handful of members of the Covenant congregation meet each Monday afternoon at the local El Jardin restaurant to write notes of encouragement to people who attended on Sunday, but also anyone in the community needing prayer and encouragement.

"We identify those who need encouragement through word of mouth," says Pastor Dusty Bach. "We live in a tight-knit rural community, and word can spread rather quickly about those in our community who need encouragement."

At other times, Bach says, "God just puts the names of people on our hearts, and we send them a note on the prompting of the Holy Spirit. The team then gathers and discusses the needs we are aware of, and which needs are appropriate."

The ministry began as a way to connect with first-time visitors, but it quickly grew into an opportunity to respond to prayer requests received on Sunday and show appreciation to those who are serving in Grace Hills ministries. It quickly grew beyond its original intentions.
