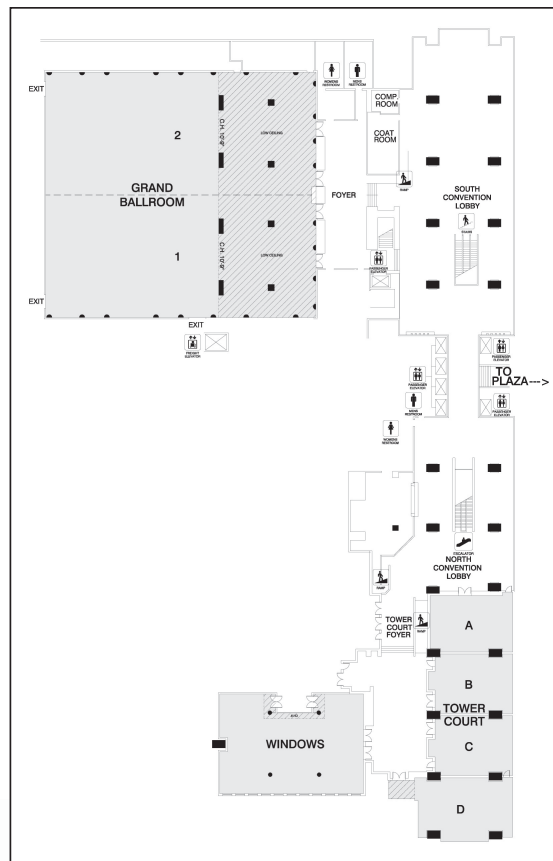
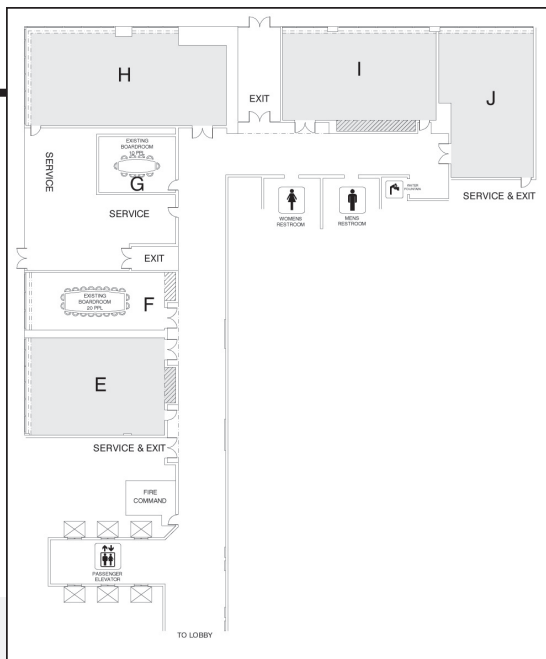

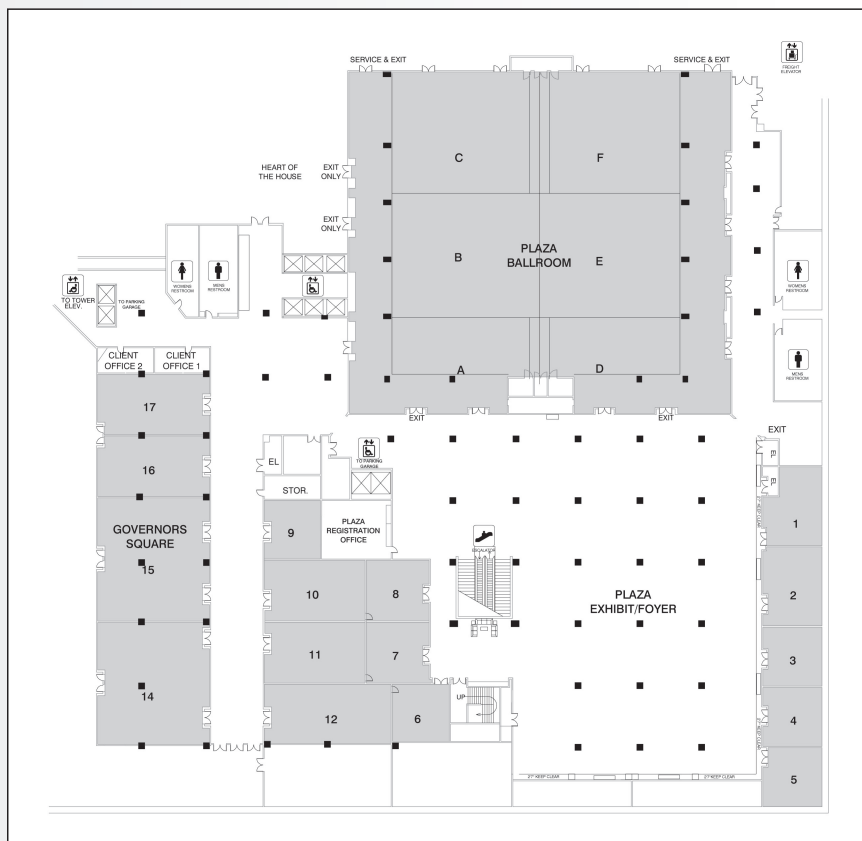

#### Emotionally Healthy Leadership: Foundations

Second, we will practice emotionally healthy skills vital to begin transforming the way the church, as the new family of Jesus, relates to one another. Finally, we will look at how to integrate these transformational concepts into the entire church.

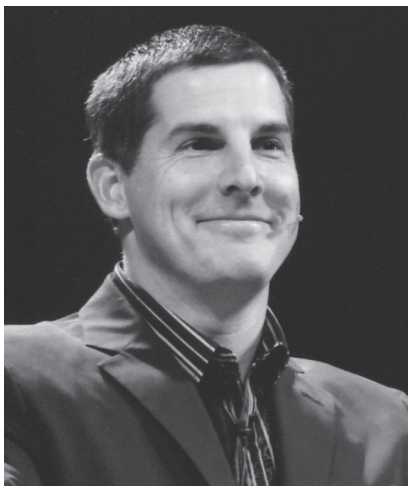
